It's Not a Matter of If, But When

"It is inevitable that offenses will come..."

• I have always shared with people getting married, or joining a church, or building a new friendship – getting hurt is a foregone conclusion.

The Damage is Catastrophic

"But woe to him through whom they come..."

Enormous Pain and Loss

- o Both friendships ended harshly for reasons I still don't know or understand

The Deadliest Trap

John Bevere's Best Selling book on Offense is "The Bait of Satan"

Bevere points out that in Luke 17:1 Greek word for "Offense" is Skandalon – part of the trap where you placed the bait.

Anyone who has trapped animals knows a trap needs one of two things to be successful. It must either be hidden, in the hope that the animal will stumble upon it, or it must be baited to lure the animal into the trap's deadly jaws. The enemy of our souls has incorporated both...One of his most deceptive and insidious kinds of bait is something that every Christian has encountered – offense.

Offended people produce much fruit, such as hurt, anger, outrage, jealousy, resentment, strife, bitterness and envy...and the results of holding on to offense include insults, attacks, wounding, division, separation, broken relationships, betrayal, and backsliding. Often those who are offended do not even realize they are trapped. They are oblivious to their condition because they are so focused on the wrong that was done to them.
