


Old Testament
Genesis 2:9




Tree of Life

Genesis 7:16




The Ark

Genesis 28:12




Jacob's Ladder

Passover Lamb

In this passage in Exodus, the children of Israel were told to partake of the first Passover lamb. This lamb is a picture of Christ as our redemption - the start of our experience of God's salvation.

The next day he saw Jesus coming to him and said, Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!—John 1:29



Manna

Old Testament
Exodus 16:4

After leaving Egypt, the children of Israel were given nothing but manna to eat for 40 years. The manna is a picture of God's desire to be man's food, life and life supply.

New Testament
John 6:32-35,
6:48-51

Jesus said to them, I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me shall by no means hunger, and he who believes into Me shall by no means ever thirst. —John 6:35



The Rock

Old Testament
Exodus 17:6

Just like the rock, Christ was "struck" on the cross so living water would flow out to God's people. This rock also followed the children of Israel, showing us that Christ is following His believers.

New Testament
1 Cor. 10:4

And all drank the same spiritual drink; for they drank of a spiritual rock which followed them, and the rock was Christ. —1 Corinthians 10:4



Tabernacle

Old Testament
Exodus 40:2-34

The tabernacle is a picture of the building of God's dwelling place. The building that is taking place today is the actual and practical experience we have in our Christian life, with one another and in the church.

New Testament
John 1:14,
Heb. 9:11

And the Word became flesh and tabernacled among us (and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only Begotten from the Father), full of grace and reality. —John 1:14



Land of Canaan

Old Testament
Deut. 8:7-19

New Testament

Solomon

Old Testament
2 Sam. 7:12-13

Solomon typifies Jesus in the New Testament. Just as Solomon built God's physical dwelling place, so is Jesus building a spiritual dwelling in us today.

Luke 1:32-33,
Luke 11:31

The queen of the south will rise up in the judgment with the men of this generation and will condemn them, because she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon, and behold, something more than Solomon is here. —Luke 11:31



Temple

Old Testament
1 Kings 6:1

The temple Solomon built typifies Christ and His Body. As we receive Christ, we in resurrection, can enter into God as our dwelling place.

New Testament
John 2:19-21

Jesus answered and said to them, Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up. —John 2:19
