Navigating the Hard Sayings

- 1. Be Open to Your Traditions, Preconceptions, and Prejudices Being Challenged.
- 2. Ask the Holy Spirit for Understanding.
- 3. Relentlessly Search and Dig for Kingdom Truth and the Knowledge of God.
- 4. Learn About Differences Linguistically and Culturally That Affect Your Understanding.
- 5. Humble Yourself and Allow Jesus' Words Supremacy in Your Life.

Matthew 11:12

And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has been treated violently, and violent men take it by force.

Luke 16:16

"The Law and the Prophets *were proclaimed* until John *came*; since that time the gospel of the kingdom of God has been preached, and everyone is forcing his way into it.

- Matthew and Luke have different versions of the same original saying.
- We need to try to understand:
 - \circ $\;$ What each version meant in the context the writer placed it $\;$
 - What they mean in the context of Jesus' ministry
 - o How that truth translates universally

Matthew's Context (Matthew 11:1-24)

- John the Baptist Imprisoned (11:1-15)
 - o John's faith struggle considering his circumstances
 - Soon to be beheaded
- Sinful Generation (11:16-19)
 - \circ Selfish
 - o Faultfinding with the Kingdom Messengers
 - o Resistant to the Truth of the Kingdom
 - "Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds"
- Unrepenting Cities (11:20-24)
 - Unwilling to Receive the Kingdom

"Has been treated violently"

"Violent men take it by force"

Luke's Context (Luke 16:1-31)

- Double Minded Attempts of Religious People to Serve God and Money (16:1-18)
 - Jesus' Rebuke (16:15-18)
 - False Airs Called Out
 - God's Truth Will Reveal
- The End of Life Will Reveal Who's Who (16:19-31)
 - o The Rich Man and Lazarus
 - Even Someone Risen From the Dead Will Not Convince This Generation of Kingdom Truth (16:27-31)
